## — Matthew 24.1-3 — Kingdom Mini-Series 14 The Olivet Discourse: What Are the Disciples Asking?

Mat 24.1 Then Jesus went out and departed from the temple, and His disciples came up to show Him the buildings of the temple. 2 And Jesus said to them, "Do you not see all these things? Assuredly, I say to you, not one stone shall be left here upon another, that shall not be thrown down." 3 Now as He sat on the Mount of Olives, the disciples came to Him privately, saying, "Tell us, when will these things be? And what will be the sign of Your coming, and of the end of the age?"

- \* The disciples' questions about Christ's "coming" and "the end of the age" make us moderns think they are asking about what?
- \* That leads to serious problems, because skeptics and atheists use it to charge that Jesus is a ...
- \* The Greek word here for "coming" is *parousia*, which simply means ...

Phil 2.12 Therefore, my beloved, as you have always obeyed, not only in my <u>presence</u> [parousia], but now much more in my absence, work out your own salvation with fear and trembling.

\* How does parousia take on the meaning of "coming"?

1Cor 16.17 I am glad about <u>the coming</u> [parousia] of Stephanas, Fortunatus, and Achaicus, for what was lacking on your part they supplied.

\* Parousia sometimes is used to distinguish

presence from \_\_\_\_\_ presence.

2Pet 1.16-17 We did not follow cleverly devised tales when we

made known to you the power and <u>coming</u> [parousia] <u>of our Lord Jesus Christ</u>, but we were eyewitnesses of His majesty.

- \* In 2Thes 2.1-2, Paul refers to "the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ" as
