Hebrews 13.5 Let your conduct be without covetousness; be content with such things as you have. For he himself has said, "I will never leave you nor forsake you." 6 So we may boldly say: "The LORD is my helper; I will not fear. What can man do to me?"

Deut 31:3 "The LORD your God Himself crosses over [the Jordan] before you; He will destroy these nations from before you, and you shall dispossess them ... 6 Be strong and of good courage, do not fear nor be afraid of them; for the LORD your God, He is the One who goes with you. He will not leave you nor forsake you."

Psalm 118.6 "The LORD is on my side; I will not fear. What can man do to me?"

* Why does Paul apply these OT texts to the NT church?

Mat 28.20 "[L]o, i am with you always, even to the end of the age."

1Cor 10.6 Now these things happened [to God's OT people] as examples for us [NT believers], so that we would not crave evil things as they [did]. 7 [Nor] be idolaters ... 8 Nor ... act immorally ... 9 Nor ... try the Lord ... 10 Nor grumble, as some of them did ... 11 ... [T]hese things happened to them as our example, and they were written for our instruction ...

Psalm 112:1 Praise the LORD! Blessed is the man who fears the LORD, Who delights greatly in His commandments. 2 His descendants will be mighty on earth; The generation of the upright will be blessed. 3 Wealth and riches will be in his house, And his righteousness endures forever.

Deut 8.9 ... you will eat food without scarcity, ... you will not lack anything ... [you will] have ... good houses ..., 13 and ... your herds and your flocks [will] multiply, and your silver and gold [will] multiply, and all that you have [will] multipl[y], 14 ... [so much so that you will be tempted to] become proud and ... forget the LORD your God"
