Romans 6.19 I speak in human terms because of the weakness of your flesh. For just as you presented your members as slaves of uncleanness, and of lawlessness leading to more lawlessness, so now present your members as slaves of righteousness for holiness. 20 For when you were slaves of sin, you were free in regard to righteousness. 21 What fruit did you have then in the things of which you are now ashamed? For the end of those things is death. 22 But now having been set free from sin, and having become slaves of God, you have your fruit to holiness, and the end, everlasting life. 23 For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Mat. 8.11 ... many will come from east and west, and sit down with Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob in the kingdom of heaven. 12 But the sons of the kingdom will be <u>cast out into outer darkness</u>. There will be <u>weeping and gnashing of teeth</u>."

Gal. 5.19 Now the works of the flesh are evident, which are: adultery, fornication, uncleanness, lewdness, 20 idolatry, sorcery, hatred, contentions, jealousies, outbursts of wrath, selfish ambitions, dissensions, heresies, 21 envy, murders, drunkenness, revelries, and the like; of which I tell you beforehand, just as I also told you in time past, that those who practice such things will not inherit the kingdom of God.

Prov. 8.36 "But He who sins against me injures himself; all those who hate me love death."

1John 3.2 Beloved, now we are children of God; and it has not yet been revealed what we shall be, but we know that when He is revealed, <u>we shall be like Him</u>, for we shall see Him as He is.

- What do we receive along the way?

Gal. 5.22 But the <u>fruit of the Spirit</u> is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, 23 gentleness, self-control. Against such there is no law.

Acts 26.17 ... the Gentiles, to whom I now send you 18 to open their eyes, in order to turn them from darkness to light, and from the power [the reign] of Satan to God, that they may receive forgiveness of sins and an <u>inheritance</u> among those who are sanctified by faith in Me.'

Col. 3.24 knowing that from the Lord you will receive the reward of the <u>inheritance</u>; for you <u>serve</u> the Lord Christ.

Rom. 8.16 The Spirit Himself bears witness with our spirit that we are <u>children</u> of God, 17 and if <u>children</u>, then <u>heirs</u>—<u>heirs</u> of God and joint <u>heirs</u> with Christ ...

Gal. 4.1 ... the heir, as long as he is a child, does not differ at all from <u>a slave, though he is master of all</u>, 2 but is under guardians and stewards until the time appointed by the father.
