Luke 3.38 ... Seth, the son of Adam, the son of God.

Heb 12.7 ... God deals with you as with sons; for what son is there whom a father does not discipline? 8 But if you are without discipline, ... then you are illegitimate and not sons ... 9 ... [W]e had earthly fathers ... 10 [who] disciplined us ... as seemed best to them, but [God] disciplines us for our good, so that we may share his holiness. 11 All discipline ... seems not to be joyful, but sorrowful; yet to those who have been trained by it, afterwards it yields the peaceful fruit of righteousness.
