The Personalness and Assurance of God's Salvation

Rom 8.28 And we know that all things work together for good to those who love God, to those who are the called according to His purpose. 29 For whom He foreknew, He also predestined to be conformed to the image of His Son, that He might be the firstborn among many brethren. 30 Moreover whom He predestined, these He also called; whom He called, these He also justified; and whom He justified, these He also glorified.

* **God** causing all things to work together for to those who love him, and God assuring salvation to fallen people in this fallen world both demand a ______ God.

* **And** yet, Christians love and embrace the former, while often rejecting or turning a cold shoulder to the latter. Why?

* Ironically, the true upshot of God's sovereignty in salvation as presented in the Bible is to demonstrate and prove the utter of God's saving love from start to finish.

* **How** do these verses show the typical usage of the Greek word "foreknow"?

Acts 26.5 since they [i.e., the Jewish leaders] <u>have known</u> about me for a long time, if they are willing to testify, that I lived as a Pharisee according to the strictest sect of our religion.

2Pet 3.17 You therefore, beloved, since you <u>know this beforehand</u>, beware lest you also fall from your own steadfastness, being led away with the error of the wicked

Amos 3.2 "You only <u>have I known</u> of all the families of the earth; Therefore I will punish you for all your iniquities."
