## When Isaac Was Old and He Could Not See

Gen 26 34 When Esau was forty years old, he took as wives Judith the daughter of Beeri the Hittite, and Basemath the daughter of Elon the Hittite. <sup>35</sup> And they were a grief of mind to Isaac and Rebekah. 27 Now it came to pass, when Isaac was old and his eves were so dim that he could not see, that he called Esau his older son and said to him, "My son." And he answered him, "Here I am." <sup>2</sup>Then he said, "Behold now, I am old. I do not know the day of my death. 3 Now therefore, please take your weapons, your quiver and your bow, and go out to the field and hunt game for me. <sup>4</sup> And make me savory food, such as I love, and bring it to me that I may eat, that my soul may bless you before I die." <sup>5</sup> Now Rebekah was listening when Isaac spoke to Esau his son. And Esau went to the field to hunt game and to bring it. <sup>6</sup>So Rebekah spoke to Jacob her son, saying, "Indeed I heard your father speak to Esau your brother, saying, <sup>7</sup> 'Bring me game and make savory food for me, that I may eat it and bless you in the presence of the LORD before my death.' 8 Now therefore, my son, obey my voice according to what I command you. 9 Go now to the flock and bring me from there two choice kids of the goats, and I will make savory food from them for your father, such as he loves. <sup>10</sup> Then you shall take it to your father, that he may eat it, and that he may bless you before his death."
