The virgin's name was Mary. 28 And having come in, the angel said to her, "Rejoice, highly favored one, the Lord is with you; blessed are you among women!" 29 But when she saw him, she was troubled at his saying, and considered what manner of greeting this was. 30 Then the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God."			
► G's proclamation to Mary (28-37) is known in the RC church			
as "the Annunciation," and G's greeting (28) in the Latin			
Vulgate (the de facto Bible for the Western church			
400-1500AD) is the root of much RC Mariology: e.g., That			
Mary is a reservoir of; That Mary was the			
result of "immaculate conception," i.e., without original			
; That Mary remained a perpetual			
; That Mary was assumed (taken up),			
body and soul, into ("the Assumption").			
Vs 28 in the Vulgate says, "Hail (greetings), O one full of			
grace," whereas the original Greek says, "Hail, O favored one"			
(i.e., a recipient of grace), which is confirmed by vs 30.			

31 "And behold, you will conceive in your womb and bring forth a Son, and shall call His name Jesus. 32 He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Highest; and the Lord God will give Him the throne of His father David. 33 And He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of His kingdom there will be no end."

▶ Gabriel is referring to God's promise to David in 2Sam 7.

2Sam 7.12 "When your days are fulfilled and you rest with your fathers, I will set up your seed after you, who will come from your body, and I will establish his kingdom. 13 He shall build a house for My name, and I will establish the throne of his kingdom forever.

14 I will be his Father, and he shall be My son. If he commits iniquity, I will chasten him with the rod of men and with the blows of the sons of men."

Solomon fulfilled this preliminarily as a ______ of Christ, but like all OT types, Solomon had failings that made it clear he was only a type, and not the promised Son of David.

34 Then Mary said to the angel, "How can this be, since I do not know a man?" 35 And the angel answered and said to her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Highest will overshadow you; therefore, also, that Holy One who is to be born will be called the Son of God."

Mat 1.20-21 tells us that an angel also appeared to Joseph, telling him to take Mary as his wife, for the child she carried was of the Holy Spirit, and the child was to be named Jesus, for he would save his people from their sins. Between the angel's words to Mary and to Joseph, we can see God connecting two things that we often separate — Christ's ______hood and his _____ship, his purchase of sin's pardon and his _____over the world.
