Rom 8.5 For those who live according to the flesh set their minds on the things of the flesh, but those who live according to the Spirit, the things of the Spirit. 6 For to be carnally minded is death, but to be spiritually minded is life and peace. 7 Because the carnal mind is enmity against God; for it is not subject to the law of God, nor indeed can be. 8 So then, those who are in the flesh cannot please God. 9 But you are not in the flesh but in the Spirit, if indeed the Spirit of God dwells in you. Now if anyone does not have the Spirit of Christ, he is not His.

In this part of Rom 8, Paul is ensuring that we fully appreciate:			
(1) That being in Christ Jesus means a complete change of the			
we belong to, the power that rules over			
us, and indeed of our very identity; and (2) that such a radical			
change of status necessarily means a similar change in how			
we Paul already intro'd these themes in vs 2 & 4.			
Vs 2 For the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus has made me free from the law of sin and death 4 that the righteous requirement of the law might be fulfilled in us who do not walk according to the flesh but according to the Spirit.			
Col 1.13 [The Father] has delivered us from the power of darkness and conveyed us into the kingdom of the Son of his love			
In vs 5, "" is not there in the Greek; it simply			
says "those who are according to the flesh," as opposed to			
"those who are according to the Spirit." Paul is talking about			
our Are we "in the flesh" or "in the Spirit"?			
In other words, what is the ruling power that has jurisdiction			
over us? Is it the flesh or the Spirit? Because that will tell us			
what kingdom are we in, the kingdom of darkness or the			
kingdom of the Son of God's love.			
"In the flesh" or "according to the flesh" refers to those who			
do not have the dwelling in them; to those			
who are "in" as opposed to "in Christ"; to those			
who are fallen, and have not been regenerated by the Spirit.			
In vs 6, Paul point is that the whole inner
