“The very idea that the world or the self has an intrinsic nature — one which the physicist or the poet may have glimpsed [(in other words, the very idea of objective reality or knowledge)] — is a remnant of the idea that the world is a divine creation, the work of someone who had something in mind, who Himself spoke some language in which He described His own project.” (Richard Rorty, *Contingency, Irony, and Solidarity* (Cambridge University Press, 1989) 21).

Luke 2.46 ... they found Him in the temple, sitting in the midst of the teachers, ... listening ... and asking ... questions. 47 And all who heard Him were astonished at His understanding and answers.

Mat 4.1 Jesus was led up by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil ... 3 Now when the tempter came to Him ... 4 He answered and said, "It is written, 'Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God.'" ... 7 Jesus said to him, "It is written again, 'You shall not tempt the LORD your God.'" ... 10 Then Jesus said to him, "Away with you, Satan! For it is written, 'You shall worship the LORD your God, and Him only you shall serve.'"

Mat 27.46 And about the ninth hour Jesus cried out with a loud voice, saying, ... "My God, My God, why have You forsaken Me?" (quoting Psalm 22.1)

Luke 24.13 Now behold, two of them were traveling ... to ... Emmaus ... 15 So it was, while they conversed and reasoned, that Jesus Himself drew near and went with them. 16 But their eyes were restrained, so that they did not know Him ... 25 Then He said to them, "O foolish ones, and slow of heart to believe in all that the prophets have spoken! 26 Ought not the Christ to have suffered these things and to enter into His glory?" 27 And beginning at Moses and all the Prophets, He expounded to them in all the Scriptures the things concerning Himself. 28 Then they drew near to the village ... 29 they constrained Him, saying, "Abide with us, for it is toward evening, and the day is far spent." ... 30 Now it came to pass, as He sat at the table with them, that He took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to them. 31 Then their eyes were opened and they knew Him; and He vanished from their sight. 32 And they said to one another, "Did not our heart burn within us while He talked with us on the road, and while He opened the Scriptures to us?" (cf. Jer 15.16 "Your words were found, and I ate them, And Your word was to me the joy and rejoicing of my heart)
