

**“There Is No Distinction Between Jew and Gentile”**

Rom 10.9 [I]f you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved. 10 For with the heart one believes unto righteousness, and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation. 11 For the Scripture says, “Whoever believes on Him will not be put to shame.” 12 For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek, for the same Lord over all is rich to all who call upon Him. 13 For “whoever calls on the name of the LORD shall be saved.”

\* **What was the** “middle wall of separation” between Jews and Gentiles in the OT?

Eph 2.14 He Himself ... has broken down the middle wall of separation, 15 having abolished in His flesh the enmity, that is, the law of commandments contained in ordinances, so as to create in Himself one new man from the two, thus making peace, 16 and that He might reconcile them both to God in one body ...

Heb 11.31 By faith the harlot Rahab did not perish with those who did not believe ...

– Ruth (Ruth 1.16; Mat 1.5-6)

Heb 3.17 Now with whom was He angry forty years? Was it not with those who sinned, whose corpses fell in the wilderness? ... 19 So we see that they could not enter in because of unbelief.

Deut 31.11 “[W]hen all Israel comes to appear before the LORD your God ..., you shall read this law before all Israel in their hearing 12 ... men and women and little ones, and the stranger who is within your gates, that they may hear and ... learn to fear the LORD your God”

Deut 16. Deu 16:10 “[Y]ou shall keep the Feast of Weeks ... 13 ... [and] the Feast of Tabernacles ... 14 And you shall rejoice ..., you and your son and your daughter, your male ... and ... female servant and the Levite, the stranger and the fatherless and the widow, who are within your gates.

Gal 3.24 [T]he law was our tutor to bring us to Christ ...  
4.1 ... [T]he heir, as long as he is a child, does not differ at all  
from a slave, though he is master of all, 2 but is under guardians  
and stewards until the time appointed by the father ...  
4 But when the fullness of the time had come, God sent forth His  
Son ... 5 ... that we might receive the adoption as sons.

Deut 10.12 "And now, Israel, what does the LORD your God  
require of you, but to fear the LORD your God, to walk in all His  
ways and to love Him, to serve the LORD your God with all your  
heart and with all your soul, 13 and to keep the commandments  
of the LORD ... which I command you today for your good?"

1Tim 4.1 [S]ome will ... heed ... doctrines of demons ... 3 ...  
commanding to abstain from foods which God created to be  
received with thanksgiving by those who believe and know the  
truth. 4 For every creature of God is good, and nothing is to be  
refused if it is received with thanksgiving ...

**\* What happens** if the people lose that heart and mind?  
How did that show up in first century Israel?

1Cor 9.9 For it is written in the law ..., "You shall not muzzle an  
ox while it treads out the grain." Is it oxen God is concerned  
about? 10 Or does He say it altogether for our sakes? For our  
sakes, no doubt, ... that he who plows should plow in hope, and  
he who threshes ... should be partaker of his hope. (cf. 1Tm 5.17)

Mal 1.2 "I have loved you," says the LORD. "But you say, 'How  
have You loved us?'... 11 ... My name shall be great among the  
Gentiles ..., 12 [b]ut you profane it ... 3.14 You have said, 'It is  
useless to serve God; What profit is it that we have kept His  
ordinance, and that we have walked as mourners before the LORD  
of hosts?'"

**\* How was Israel** like Colonial Williamsburg or Rothenburg,

Mat 15.7 "Hypocrites! Well did Isaiah prophesy about you,  
saying: 8 'These people draw near to Me with their mouth, and  
honor Me with their lips, but their heart is far from Me. 9 And in  
vain they worship Me, teaching as doctrines the commandments  
of men.' "

Deut 4.6 [T]his is your wisdom and your understanding in the  
sight of the peoples who will hear all these statutes, and say,  
"Surely this great nation is a wise and understanding people."  
7 For what great nation is there that has God so near to it ...?

Matt 21.12 And Jesus entered the temple and drove out all those  
who were buying and selling in the temple, and overturned the  
tables of the money changers and the seats of those who were  
selling doves. 13 And He said to them, "It is written, 'MY HOUSE  
SHALL BE CALLED A HOUSE OF PRAYER'; but you are making it a  
ROBBERS' DEN."

Eze 16:14 "Your fame went out among the nations because of  
your beauty, for it was perfect through My splendor which I had  
bestowed on you," says the Lord GOD.
