## *—* Romans 12.3-8 *—* Romans Series 77 We, Being Many, Are One Body in Christ

Rom 12.3 For I say, through the grace given to me, to everyone who is among you, not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think, but to think soberly, as God has dealt to each one a measure of faith. 4 For as we have many members in one body, but all the members do not have the same function, 5 so we being many, are one body in Christ, and individually members of one another. 6 Having then gifts differing according to the grace that is given to us, let us use them: if prophecy, lit us prophesy in proportion to our faith; 7 if ministry, let us use it in our ministering; he who teaches, in teaching; 8 he who exhorts, in exhortation; he who gives, with liberality; he who leads, with diligence; he who shows mercy, with cheerfulness. 9 Let love be without hypocrisy. Abhor what is evil. Cling to what is good. 10 Be kindly affectionate to one another with brotherly love, in honor giving preference to one another; 11 not lagging in diligence, fervent in spirit, serving the Lord; 12 rejoicing in hope, patient in tribulation, continuing steadfastly in prayer; 13 distributing to the needs of the saints, given to hospitality. 14 Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse. 15 Rejoice with those who rejoice, and weep with those who weep. 16 Be of the same mind toward one another. Do not se your mind on high things, but associate with the humble. Do not be wise in your own opinion.

Eph 2.8 by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God, 9 ... lest anyone should boast.

1Cor 12.1 Now concerning spiritual gifts, brethren, I do not want you to be ignorant ... 3 Therefore I make known to you that ... no one can say that Jesus is Lord except by the Holy Spirit. 4 There are diversities of gifts, but the same Spirit. 5 There are differences of ministries, but the same Lord ... 7 But the manifestation of the Spirit is given to each one for the profit of all

Luke 9.30 Moses and Elijah ... appeared ... and spoke [with Jesus] of His decease [lit., "exodus"] which He was about to accomplish

1Cor 10.1 [A]II our fathers ... passed through the sea, ... 3 all ate the same spiritual food, 4 and all drank the same spiritual drink. For they drank of that spiritual Rock that followed them, and that Rock was Christ ... 11 Now all these things happened to them as examples, and they were written for our admonition

Deut 8. 2 [T]he Lord your God led you all the way these forty years in the wilderness ... 3 ... He ... fed you with manna ... 4 Your garments did not wear out ... nor did your foot swell

Josh 5.12 [T]he manna ceased on the day after they had eaten the produce of the land

Eph 4.11 [Christ] gave some to be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, and some pastors and teachers, 12 for the equipping of the saints for the work of ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ

Heb 1.1 God, who ... spoke in time past to the fathers by the prophets, 2 has in these last days spoken to us by His Son ... 3 who being the brightness of His glory and the express image of His person, ... when He had by Himself purged our sins, sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high
