2 Cor 10 <sup>3</sup> For though we walk in the flesh, we do not war according to the flesh. <sup>4</sup> For the weapons of our warfare are not carnal but mighty in God for pulling down strongholds, <sup>5</sup> casting down arguments and every high thing that exalts itself against the knowledge of God, bringing every thought into captivity to the obedience of Christ

\* What is autonomy and when do we first see it?


Isa 14 [Lucifer:] <sup>14</sup> "I will be like the Most High"

Gen 3 <sup>4</sup> Then the serpent said to the woman, "You will not surely die. <sup>5</sup> For God knows that in the day you eat of it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil." ... <sup>22</sup> Then the LORD God said, "Behold, the man has become like one of Us, to know good and evil. Mat 4<sup>1</sup> Then Jesus was led up by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil. <sup>2</sup> And when He had fasted forty days and forty nights, afterward He was hungry. <sup>3</sup> Now when the tempter came to Him, he said, "If You are the Son of God, command that these stones become bread." <sup>4</sup> But He answered and said, "It is written, 'Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God.'"

Abel and his offering, <sup>5</sup> but He did not respect Cain and his offering. And Cain was very angry ... <sup>6</sup> So the LORD said to Cain, "Why are you angry?" ... <sup>7</sup> If you do well, will you not be accepted? ... [S]in lies at the door. And its desire is for you, but you should rule over it." <sup>8</sup> Now ... Cain rose up against Abel ... and killed him. <sup>9</sup> Then the LORD said to Cain ... <sup>10</sup> [t]he voice of your brother's blood cries out to Me ... <sup>12</sup> When you till the ground, it shall no longer yield its strength to you. A fugitive and a vagabond you shall be on the earth." ... <sup>16</sup> Then Cain went out from the presence of the LORD ... <sup>17</sup>... [a]nd he built a city ...

Rev 21 <sup>9</sup> Then one of the seven angels ... sa[id], "Come, I will show you the bride, the Lamb's wife." <sup>10</sup> And he carried me away in the Spirit ... and showed me the great city, the holy Jerusalem, descending out of heaven from God ... <sup>22</sup> But I saw no temple in it, for the Lord God Almighty and the Lamb are its temple. <sup>23</sup> The city had no need of the sun or of the moon to shine in it, for the glory of God illuminated it. The Lamb is its light. <sup>24</sup> And the nations of those who are saved shall walk in its light, and the kings of the earth bring their glory and honor into it.

Ezekiel 16 <sup>3</sup> Thus says the Lord GOD to Jerusalem: "Your birth and your nativity are from the land of Canaan ... <sup>6</sup> And when I ... saw you struggling in your own blood, I said to you ..., 'Live!' ... <sup>7</sup> I made you thrive ... <sup>8</sup> ... I swore an oath to you and entered into a covenant with you, and you became Mine ... <sup>9</sup> Then I ... washed off your blood, and I anointed you with oil. <sup>10</sup> I clothed you in embroidered cloth and ... with fine linen and covered you with silk. <sup>11</sup> I adorned you with ornaments ... <sup>12</sup> [a]nd I put ... a beautiful crown on your head. <sup>13</sup> ... You were exceedingly beautiful, and succeeded to royalty. <sup>14</sup> Your fame went out among the nations because of your beauty, for it was perfect through My splendor which I had bestowed on you ... <sup>15</sup> But you trusted in your own beauty, played the harlot because of your fame"
