1Cor 13.5 [Love] is not provoked \* What does the Greek word for provoked mean?

Prov 18:21 Death and life are in the power of the tongue, and those who love it will eat its fruit.

\* Who is the person Paul is describing, what do they do, and how do they affect others?

Prov 12.18 There is one who speaks like the piercings of a sword, but the tongue of the wise promotes health.

Prov 15.4 A wholesome tongue is a tree of life, but perverseness in it breaks the spirit.

James 1.19 [L]et every man be swift to hear, slow to speak, and slow to wrath; 20 for the wrath of man does not produce the righteousness of God.
