 1) Being righteous by \_\_\_\_ \_\_\_\_\_ in Christ, that is by Gen 6 <sup>9</sup> This is the genealogy of Noah. Noah was a just man, perfect in his generations. Noah walked with God. Christ's own righteousness which is ours in union with Him. \* What does the Bible tell us and not tell us about Noah? - This is the righteousness that produces our right standing with God: Gal 3 27 For all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ. \* Confusion enters because we fail to recognize that the Bible

uses "righteous" in two different ways regarding believers:

* Is moral perfection contemplated by these verses?
1Jn 1 <sup>7</sup> But if we walk in the light as He is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus Christ His Son cleanses us from all sin. <sup>8</sup> If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. <sup>9</sup> If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.
- What is the connection between "faithful" and "just"?
* The Bible also speaks of the faithfulness of believers as being ""  Rev 19 <sup>8</sup> [T]o her [the Bride of the Lamb] it was granted to be arrayed in fine linen, clean and bright, for the fine linen is the righteous acts of the saints.
