Mat 7²⁴ “[W]hoever hears these sayings of Mine, and does them, I will liken him to a wise man who built his house on the rock:

– Relationship bonds

– Governments

We believe that God, for the establishment and advancement of His Kingdom, has ordained three basic covenantal units among men—the family, the church, and the community or civil society— each with its own government. The family is foundational to and is the basic unit of church and society. All three governments are essential components of the Kingdom of God, and all are subordinate to the Word of God which assigns to each differing, yet interrelated and [mutually] dependent, spheres of responsibility. The Scriptures and history record the harm and confusion caused when any of the three governments fails to fulfill its God-given responsibilities or asserts an unbiblical independence of or superiority over the others. To fulfill their proper function, all of these governments are dependent on the grace of God, common or special, working in individuals to bring about biblical self-government. Without such self-government or self-control, no other government can function according to the Word of God. The overarching duty of every individual, family, congregation, and society is to seek first the Kingdom of God and His righteousness. (The King’s Congregation Confession of Faith, para. 34)
